- Efficient use of ITS device data and potentially shared use

- Next workshop in Fall










I-80 Corridor: More than a Single Highway for Freight



I-80 Corridor: Reefer Truck Flow

- Since 1902,
 Government water projects have transformed the West
- High value, timesensitive western fruits and vegetables are shipped primarily by reefer truck
- Preliminary data indicates that reefer trucks constitute approximately 25 to 40 percent of total truck traffic on I-80 across the Mountain West

IntelliDriveSM and Road Weather Management

- Project on Integrated Mobile Observing & Dynamic
 Decision Support pilot test
- Builds on work already underway through Clarus and MDSS
- Potential opportunity, although not clear on I-80 multistate coalition being eligible




New Project

Integrated Mobile Observing & Dynamic Decision Support Project Objectives

- 1. Derive <u>data</u> and <u>communications</u> requirements for weather, road condition, and vehicle status variables from mobile platforms (Using State DOT vehicles as the source)
- 2. Enhance and expand post-processing algorithms to turn the data into useful observations that are tied to existing mesonets (e.g., *Clarus*)
- 3. Explore the use of these and other observations in weather-related decision support systems.

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IntelliDriveSM Next Steps

- FHWA will work with State DOT(s) to support the collection and processing of the mobile data and the execution of the application
 - Coordination will be via 4 pooled fund studies:
 - Aurora
 - Clear Roads
 - MDSS
 - IntelliDriveSM
- Nat'l Center for Atmospheric Research (NCAR) will have large role in defining requirements and selecting site
- Strong Clarus focus
- Timeframe not yet defined



TIGER II Planning Grant

- Up to \$35M of TIGER II funds
- Pre-application due July 16
- Full application due August 23
- Primary criteria
 - Long-term outcomes, economic stimulus (job creation)
- Secondary criteria
 - Innovation, partnership



Potential TIGER II Planning Grant App

- I-80 Concept of Operations
 - Multi-state operations processes
 - I-80 Corridor "Real Time Traveler Info and Forecast Web site (incl. freight focus)
 - Connectivity of TMCs
 - Strategies for accurate truck counts
 - System and integration requirements to enable real-time data sharing, shared operations
